Syllabus and Rules for written tests 30/11-5/12, 2023

The syllabus constitutes eNotes 1 through 18.

The written test in the Fall syllabus is a 3-hour test in two parts:

First part: 1-hour test without any aids 30/11 or 1/12. This is an on-location test. The test is provided on paper on which your answers must be given at the last Short Day of the Fall semester. The test will be like the Weekly Tests from the semester, but note in particular:

- You must bring your student card as well as writing accessories (pen/pencil).
- The test will contain 10 randomized/varied questions which are a selection from the Weekly Tests of the Fall semester, E23.
- Remember to write your name on the test.
- You must only give final answers on your test, just as in Möbius tests. No in-between calculations or explanations will be considered during evaluation.
- As aids you only have available your writing accessories and draft paper which will be handed out.
- You are not allowed to help others nor receive help from others during the test.

Second part: 2-hour test with all by DTU permitted aids available. The test takes place Tuesday December 5. This part of the test will be similar to the concept from previous 2-hour tests in the Fall syllabus, which you can find on the course website along with solution suggestions. But the style is more free than with homework assignments – e.g. your explanatory text may be mixed with for example Maple/SymPy computations.
